



Pop-up Elements - Little Treasure Card

Materials List

Little Darlings Collection print paper

- Cherished #G4500450
- Baby Borders #G4500453
- New Arrival #G4500448
- Little Darlings #G4500442
- Rock-A-Bye #G4500447
- Chipboard words
- Cardstock in yellow and blue

Your card will be 6 inches x 6 inches so if you don't have an envelope to fit it then just change the measurements to suit your envelope.

 \bullet Cut a piece of cardstock to 6 inches x 12 inches and fold it in half.

For your cover:

- Cut a piece of Rock-a-bye paper 5 % inches wide and 4 inches high. Ink around the edges and adhered it to the front of your card near the top.
- Cut a piece of Cherish 5 ¾ inches wide and 1 ¾ inches high. This

is for the bottom of the front. Ink around the piece of paper and adhered it to your card.

- \bullet Cut a piece of blue cardstock 4 5/8 inch wide and 1 $^{5\!\!/}$ inches high. Ink the edges. Cut a piece of yellow cardstock 4 7/16 long and 1 5/8 high and ink it and adhered it to the blue piece.
- Cut four squares from New Arrival print paper and ink around the edges and adhered to the middle of the Bazzill. Adhered it to the front of your card over the join of your two print papers.
- Cut a scallop oval using a spellbinder from New Arrival, ink around the edges. Cut another oval in yellow Bazzill and ink around the edges. Tape the two together, add a little chipboard word. Add it to the front of your card with foam tape.

For the inside of your card:

• Choose one of the prints, I used New Arrivals (check side) and cut it to 6 inches x 11 inches, ink around the

edges and fold in half.

• Cut another print paper, I used Little Darlings (music side) to 6 inches x 10 inches, in around the edges and fold in half. On the left side of the fold and in the middle, add a square Rock-abye print paper 3 inches wide and 3 ½ inches high.



 From the Baby Borders sheet choose two boarders and cut them to 9 inches long and mount them on cardstock with a small amount of Bazzill showing each side. Fold them in half.



- Cut a piece of yellow card stock 2 ½ high and 9 inches long. Ink around the edges, fold in half.
- Cut a piece of blue spot paper to 2 ½ x 4 ½ inches and adhered it to the right side of the fold in the cardstock.
- Cut a piece of New Arrival 2 stamps wide and 4 stamps high, ink it around the edges and adhered it to the left side of the fold.





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- Cut a piece of blue cardstock 1 1/8 high x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ long, ink around the edges and fold in half.
- · Cut a "little darling" word from Baby Border and adhered it to the left of the fold.
- Cut a piece of blue cardstock 3 inches wide x 4 inches high. Don't forget to Ink around the edges.
- Cut a piece Rock–a-bye (spot side) paper 2 ¾ inches x 3 3/4 inches, ink around the edges and tape it to the middle of your cardstock.
- Add a smaller piece of yellow cardstock 2 inches wide and 3 inches high. This will let you add a personal message or a photo.
- Wrap a piece of organza ribbon around the square and tie with a bow at the front. Now you are ready to put it all together!
- Putting it all together:

The inside:

We are going to layer all the bits and pieces on top of each other inside your card. Every piece is only attached along the sides of your card.



By now you will have noticed that each layer is slightly smaller than the other. This gives the card its pop effect. For this reason each layer can only be attached along the sides for it to work.

· Add some tape along the edge of your piece of print paper 6 x 11. Adhered it to the edge of your card only along the sides. Add some tape along the edge of your print paper 6 x 10 and adhered it along the edge of your card only on the sides.

 Add one of your boarders to the top of your card. Adhered it along the edges of your card. Add another boarder to the bottom of your card only along the sides.



• Add the yellow cardstock strip in the middle of the two boarders, only with tape along the edges. Over the top of the yellow and in the middle add your narrow blue strip, remember only attach it along the sides of your

You are now finished. I have made quite a few of these and turned them into a mini book.
