Step One: Spray, paint, or ink all surfaces of the matchbook box.





Step Two. I sprayed my box with ink mist, and then spread the ink with a foam brush. The effect is a soft, watercolor look.

Step Three. After the ink or paint has dried, use a gel medium to adhere your paper to the box. You may choose to cover all the sides or just a few and allow your inked or painted surfaces to show.

Step Four: Use contrasting papers for a more interesting look. This is a great way to use the Graphic 45 8x8 pads or scraps from the 12x12 papers.



Step Five: Use a few simple decorations for the top of the box, allowing your gift to peek through the hole.



Step Six: Trim a postcard from one of the 8x8 collections and decorate it with a few "fussy cut" images, a button, and some twine.



Step Seven: Stamp your sentiments onto some scrap paper, then die cut them and attach them to the box. The "Scent with Love" sentiment is perfect for a gift of scented candles!



Step Eight: To keep your gift from falling out or moving around, attach it to the inside of the box with some glue dots or adhesive tape.



This little project is a quick and easy way to give a small gift (or even a gift card) for the holidays.
