## Place In Time - September Card "Off To School"

### Graphic 45® Supplies:

2 sheets September Cut-Aparts (#4500608)

### Additional Supplies:

1 sheet Black Cardstock (12 x 12)

1 sheet Tan Cardstock (12 x 12)

1 yard Black silk or faux silk ribbon (1/2" width)

12 inches Black twine or cord

1 Red button

2 1/4" Circle punch, Die cut or Provided template

### Tools:

Paper trimmer, Scissors, Scoring tool or Bone folder and scoring board, Ruler, White glue or Adhesive dots, Tape runner, 3D Foam adhesive, Postage edge decorative scissors (optional)

### Instructions:

\* All measurements are length x width.

\*\* Use a sanding block to smooth any rough edges on cardstock punch-outs or chipboard elements.

1. Cut black cardstock to 11" x 4 1/4" and score at 5 1/2" to make a top-fold card.

2. From the front of a sheet of *September Cut-Aparts* paper, trim the images shown. Use postage-edge decorative scissors to trim out the postage images, if desired.

3. Trim tan cardstock to 5 3/8" x 4 1/8" and attach to the card front.

4. From the reverse of the *September Cut-Aparts* paper, measure from the upper left corner and trim a 5 1/4" x 4" piece, make sure that the section trimmed matches the sample to the left. Attach the paper to the center of the card with the plaid portion at the top.



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5. Trim out the school children image from the *September Cut-Aparts* paper and mat it with black cardstock cut slightly larger. Attach the image to the center of the card with 3D foam adhesive.



6. Trim out two postage stamp images from the *September Cut-Aparts* paper and attach them to the lower left corner of the card front.

7. Tie a bow from black ribbon and attach it to the upper right corner of the card. Tie a length of black twine through the holes of a button and attach the button to the ribbon as shown.



8. Cut two (2) pieces of tan cardstock to 5 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub>". Open the card and attach one piece of tan cardstock to the top inside flap and one piece to the bottom.

9. Trim the September image from the *September Cut-Aparts* paper and trim it to fit the bottom panel as shown.

10. Trim black text print from the *September Cut-Aparts* paper to 2" x 4" and attach it to the top panel.



11. From the reverse of the *September Cut-Aparts* paper trim a piece that measures 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 4", making sure that the section trimmed matches the sample.

12. Using a 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-inch circle punch, die cutting template, or tracing template



(included below), trim out a circle at the top center of the card, approximately 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inches from the top.

13. Flip the paper over and attach thin strips of adhesive to the bottom, right, and left sides, making sure to place the adhesive as close to the edge as possible.

14. Attach the plaid panel to the top flap on the inside of the card, lining up the edges as shown to create a pocket.

15. Take the journaling strip cut earlier from the *September Cut-Aparts* paper and tuck it into the pocket. (Note: you can add a gift card or other item to the pocket, if you like.)
